Topic: Preventing Nuclear Terrorism

The General Assembly,

Recalling the General Assembly's resolution 64/57 of 12 January 2010 towards the acceleration of nuclear disarmament and the manifestation of a nuclear weapon-free world,

Further recalling the General Assembly's resolution 64/69 stressing the importance and urgency of a Comprehensive Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty,

Emphasizing the concern over the whereabouts of the world's nuclear weapons and the security of these weapons in non-aggressive positions,

Alarmed by the minute degree of successful oversight of the nuclear weapons of the world and the conduct of those who possess nuclear weapons or the capabilities to create nuclear weapons,

Noting with deep concern the instability and nebulosity of IAEA inspection of nuclear facilities and instruments,

Seeking the safety of all nations in a nuclear-free world without the threat of nuclear proliferation or terrorism,

1. Draws the attention of the IAEA to the disappointing and weak oversight inspections of nuclear facilities in all nations of the world;
2. Proclaims that for the safety of all nations, oversight of the world's nuclear arsenals must be more direct and continuous;
3. Instructs the IAEA to establish the individual positions of unceasing oversight inspectors to perpetually monitor and record the activities and whereabouts of distinct groups of nuclear weapons to ensure their unrelenting security;
4. Encourages member nations to contribute individuals suited to take on the position described above;

5. Expresses its hope that all member nations will comply with the above statements for the enhanced security of the world and for the implementation of total nuclear disarmament;

6. Decides to include the provisional agenda of its sixty-fifth session the item entitled “Towards the enhancement of the security of existing nuclear weapons and the irradiation of worldwide nuclear terrorism.”
