Topic: Preventing Nuclear Terrorism

The General Assembly,

*Concerned* by easy access to nuclear and atomic technology through sheer as well as improper disposal of waste,

*Realizing* that while countries may think of their nuclear facilities are secure, cooperation among nations is key in preventing nuclear material from being compromised by terrorist organizations,

*Approving* the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and its Additional Protocol model,

*Bearing in mind* the benefits of nuclear technology as an energy resource,

1. Recommends annual International Conventions on Nuclear Security in which nations share strategies to prevent nuclear terrorism and security failures at nuclear facilities, starting January 2011;
2. Further recommends that nations with nuclear programs agree to regular inspections from IAEA officials on the security in nuclear facilities and allow IAEA to oversee security development if conditions are not found to be adequate;
3. Requests nations to increase security in nuclear facilities and provide reports at annual conventions, punish those found illegally carrying nuclear material, create specialized facilities in which nuclear waste material can be stored under security, and if nations should choose not to comply, the IAEA will be given power to sanction the nation's nuclear program varying with the severity of noncompliance;
4. Condemns countries that continually develop nuclear technology for the sake of military advancement and not as an alternative to the use of fossil fuels;
5. Urges nations to heighten security in nuclear facilities as well as fund programs with the intention of finding more effective power sources as well as a safer method of storing nuclear power.
