Topic: Multinational Terrorist Groups

The Economic and Social Council,

*Acknowledging* that terrorist groups take advantage of developing countries and use the method of indoctrination to subtly induce people to justify terrorism,

*Keeping in mind* that, for the sake of national sovereignty, it is better for a nation to handle security issues itself rather than to allow an international organization to meddle in the affairs occurring within its borders,

*Further emphasizing* that terrorist groups are internationally connected and, as such, all nations in the world are susceptible to the consequences of global terrorism,

*Recalling* the Declaration of Measures to Eliminate International Terrorism in 1994, which advises countries to cooperate in the fight against terrorism,

1. Encourages the various organizations of the United Nations to help developing countries by improving their educational, economic and industrial conditions; educating people on the concept of terrorism; and supporting nations in their efforts to fortify their security systems;
2. Urges the countries represented in the United Nations to decide by their own volition to join in the treaty of allied anti-terrorism military action, which fights against terrorism throughout the world, and, in the case of military action, share all information with other nations;
3. Designates the countries of the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) to fairly judge nations targeting forces that act against peace as terrorist groups, and not those who fight for justice and political independence;
4. Requests all member states of the United Nations cease secret support of terrorist groups; prevent the means by which terrorists collect money within their borders; and share information on terrorist groups openly with others nations to fight global terrorism.
