October 2018	Friday, October 19 Camden County College Model United Nations Online Registration Deadline
	• Friday, October 26 Final deadline to submit any changes to the World Affairs Council staff regarding school registration (i.e. <i>the exact amount of students participating</i>) and turn in completed student assignments document.
	Week of October 29 Advisers receive students' Model United Nations country assignments.
November 2018	 Thursday, November 1 (3:45 p.m. – 5:00 p.m.) Faculty advisers attend an in-person Prep Session, facilitated by Council staff and hosted at Camden County College.
	• Under the direction of a faculty adviser and using the Council's curriculum materials, students begin to research their assigned country and review key concepts related to cultural diplomacy and the structure and function of the United Nations.
	• Under the direction of a faculty adviser, students review the Council's <i>Resolution Writing Workshop</i> presentation.
December 2018	• Students begin to conduct research on <i>Ending Food Insecurity</i> from the perspective of their assigned country, using briefing papers, online resources and other curriculum materials provided by the Council.
	• (OPTIONAL) Students synthesize their research by drafting one-page position papers, explaining their country's position on the assigned topic.
	• Position Paper Deadline: Friday, December 14 (OPTIONAL) Faculty advisers submit students' finalized one-page position papers to the World Affairs Council. Note: Although optional for schools, completing a position paper is strongly encouraged as it makes the resolution writing process much easier.
	• Using background research outlined in their (optional) position papers coupled with their newly acquired resolution writing skills, students begin drafting their resolutions that address potential solutions to <i>Ending Food Insecurity</i> .
January 2019	 Wednesday, January 9 – RESOLUTION DEADLINE Using background research outlined in their position papers and their resolution writing skills, students finalize their policy resolutions addressing potential solutions to <i>Ending Food Insecurity</i>. Faculty advisers review final resolutions for correct formatting and submit to Council staff.
	 Thursday, January 10 – FINAL RESOLUTION AVAILABLE Council staff select individual clauses from schools and publish a final resolution. Students review the draft of the final resolution in preparation for the Final Conference.
	 Thursday, January 17 (9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.) Students and faculty advisers attend the Model United Nations Final Conference at Camden County College, where they present, debate, amend and vote on the drafted final resolution aimed at improving the lives of people around the world with regards to the Ending Food Insecurity topic.
