

United Nations Committee: General Assembly Topic: Ending Forced Labor – Committee 1 Sponsors: Republic of Chile, Ireland, Iceland

The General Assembly,

*Bearing in mind* that the profits of forced labor make up large amounts of the profits of many regions around the world, e.g. \$51.8 billion USD in Asian-Pacific countries and \$46.9 billion USD in developed economies in the UN,

Observing that approximately 40.3 million people were victims of modern slavery,

*Having studied* the majority of the money generated by forced labor products comes from the United States, Japan, and Germany and many others,

- <u>Calls upon</u> the UN to organize extra support, in the form of professionals who are trained to spot forced labor, to cut down on cross border forced labor in regions with the most forced labor;<sup>1</sup>
- 2. <u>Further requests</u> the offer of specialized emergency accommodation and use of apartments and houses with outreach support to victims;<sup>2</sup>
- 3. <u>Suggests</u> that those countries enforce tariffs on products made by forced laborers such as smart devices, clothing, fish, and chocolate, among others.<sup>3</sup>
