

United Nations Committee: General Assembly **Topic:** Ending Forced Labor – Committee 2

Sponsors: United Mexican States, Kingdom of Sweden, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

The General Assembly,

Concerned that 80% of the population live on \$10 a day and that 40% of the population live on \$2 a day,

Deeply concerned with the statistic that 71% of the now free 35,000 Brazilian workers were found illiterate and had four or less years of schooling,

Keeping in mind that 21 million people around the world are victims of forced labor,

- 1. <u>Demands</u> all countries in the UN tax and tariff all known businesses that export forced-labor made products;¹
- 2. <u>Encourages</u> the creation of programs for now-safe forced labor victims to increase their literacy skills and further their educational endeavors;²
- 3. <u>Emphasizes</u> the creation of traveling laws that would reduce the amount of people trapped in forced labor.³
