The General Assembly,

Keeping in mind on February 25th, 2020 approximately 5,500 children and adults were separated from their families due to immigration issues and poverty¹,

Emphasizing the fact that most of the locations with the highest concentrations of refugees are some of the poorest countries in the world,

Bearing in mind that as of April 1st, 2020 91% of the world's population lives in a country with travel restrictions, and about three-billion people that have completely closed their borders because of COVID-19²,

- 1.) Recommends that the General Assembly create more temporary buildings for families to stay until they find a place to live in order to stop family separation.
- 2.) Urges the UNHCR and wealthier countries that are part of the United Nations to build and supply refugee centers with funding and resources so as not to strain these poor countries anymore.
- 3.) Encourages philanthropic foundations and NGOs to provide resources for migrants throughout the COVID-19 health crisis, and to help create self travel conditions for migrants following the outbreak.
