How to Video Record your Jr. Model UN **Opening** Speech

Step by Step!

Write a 2-5 minute opening speech on your topic and assigned subcommittee from the perspective of your assigned country.



What should be in your speech?

- Your speech should include (checklist):
 - Your name, your school, your grade, and what your assigned country and subtopic is...this is your "intro" to the video and should be done at the very beginning.
 - Information (facts and statistics) regarding the topic and your assigned subcommittee. Remember that your audience is the General Assembly (all Model UN countries) and you are a delegate representing your assigned country.
 - How your subcommittee topic impacts your assigned country (region, or the world); Mention any challenges and areas of progress.
 - Why it's important for world leaders to act quickly to solve the issue. Include a few possible solutions to the issue. **THINK**: How can/should the General Assembly come together to solve the issue?
 - Closing: Wrap up your thoughts, say thank you, & have a strong conclusion!



Tips on making a GREAT video

- Remember to use the most relevant and up-to-date information from your research in your video.
- Follow the writing process when creating your 'script' for your speech
 - brainstorm, plan, draft, revise, editand produce a final product.
- Be clear and concise in your video...practice makes perfect!



Tips on making a GREAT video

- If using the camera feature on your phone or tablet, hold it horizontally, as opposed to vertically.
- Speak slowly and clearly. Make sure to enunciate your words.
- Consider having other people screen your video before you submit it.
- Be creative. You can use pictures, voice over, and other editing applications!



Tips on making a GREAT video

- Make sure you follow all of the stated rules and guidelines, including length, and content
- If you can, list all of the sources you used in the end credits (this is optional and not required)
- Have fun and show off your public speaking skills!



When you film your video...

- Make sure you have a good quality camera.
 You can use an Iphone, android, ipad, tablet, or digital camera.
- Dress to impress! Wear business casual clothing, or you can even dress in the traditional dress of your assigned country (if you want to!)
- Make sure you have good lighting. Film during the day and in a well lit room with minimal distractions.
- Consider using a flag or UN image as a digital backdrop/green screen.






