



DEAR COUNCIL TRAVELERS,

I am delighted to present to you an opportunity to trace the path of traders, explorers, and emperors along the fabled Silk Road, with most of the **travel aboard a comfortable and convenient private plane**. Begin appropriately in **Venice**, Marco Polo's home where many expeditions originated; visit a plethora of **UNESCO World Heritage Sites** that were important stops along Silk Road routes in **Georgia** and **Uzbekistan**; and conclude in **Istanbul**, terminus for many Silk Road caravans.

Following the fabled silk trade route by land involves long drives and restrictive, time-consuming commercial air travel. Traveling by train limits the time available to explore the most intriguing cities along the way. Having our own private aircraft allows us to **maximize the time spent at key points of interest** and historic outposts. Most stopovers are two to three nights to provide ample time to delve deep in each location. This is the perfect itinerary for a privately chartered aircraft!

We'll travel aboard a Canadian-built De Havilland Dash 8-400, the world's most advanced turboprop, significantly more efficient than aircraft with jet engines. Ours is configured with 72 Economy Class seats, but we are assigning two seats per person, so each of our **maximum 32 trip participants** will have both a window seat and a free seat next to them, with ample overhead storage and an armrest that can be raised to provide extra space and comfort. The seven on-tour flights average about one hour and 45 minutes in duration.

This unique and exciting program will likely fill quickly, so please reserve your space by contacting our office or using the enclosed form. We hope you will join this peerless exploration of a historically complex region amid truly stunning surroundings and world-class accommodations.



HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel between cities and regions aboard a comfortable and convenient private aircraft, avoiding long, complicated drives and the hassle of commercial air travel.
- ◆ Take part in a unique wine making experience in Georgia and a hands-on ceramic workshop in Uzbekistan.
- ◆ Learn about the once-lost technique of creating Samarkand silk paper, which has been restored with a sustainable manufacturing method.
- Enjoy a performance by the National Instruments Academic Orchestra in Registan Square, Samarkand.
- See a special Dervish performance and enjoy local cocktails in a private undergound cistern in Istanbul.



For this expedition, our aircraft will be used for eight comfortable on-tour flights ranging in duration from 45 minutes to 3 ½ hours, with most flights lasting just 90 minutes. Where private air terminals are available, we will efficiently and quickly move through security, customs, and immigration formalities without the long waits typical of public air terminals.

HIGHLIGHT VISITS

VENICE

Already a powerful trade hub, it was from Venice that Marco Polo set off on his famous expedition to the east in 1271, returning in 1295 with stories about eastern cultures, peoples, traditions, and goods. Stay at the celebrated Cipriani hotel while visiting Marco Polo's house and the Doge's Palace. Also learn about the production of handmade velvet and the history of Venice's famous costume makers.



TBILISI

The Caucasian route of Silk Road trade, through Tbilisi, gained importance in the 6th century and continued through the 14th century. While visiting its important sites, learn about the long list of conquerors and rulers that have fought for control of this strategic location, try your hand in traditional Georgian wine making, and take part in local handicraft workshops.



TASHKENT

Tashkent is a large, sprawling city with a fascinating mix of ancient Islamic and modern Soviet history. Accompanied by a local food expert, explore the bustling Chorsu Bazaar, featuring a wide range of food, local produce, and crafts, giving us a sense of life at the height of the Silk Road trading days. Examine the combined legacies of European and Asian settlers and try your hand at traditional ceramics.



SAMARKAND

Samarkand has long been a central point for trade across the region, and was a substantial city with a citadel and strong fortifications, renowned for its craft production, several centuries before it was conquered by Alexander in 329 BCE. Explore the Old City, including iconic Registan Square; visit a traditional family bakery; and delve into local silk craftwork, including paper and carpet making.



BUKHARA

One of the most prosperous cities in Central Asia throughout the Middle Ages, Bukhara was famous not only for exchange between merchants, but also for culture, scholarship, and religious studies. It was particularly renowned for its textile industry, but also celebrated for gold embroidery and metal work, and many of these crafts are still practised in the city today.



KHIVA

Another historic center for education, science, and culture, best known for the imposing walls and grand gates of Ichan Kala, the fortified inner city, Khiva also boasts the most unique tiled minarets along the SIlk Road. Be entertained by traditional giant puppets and local musicians before an exploration of the city's substantial outer walls, ancient mosque, and famously unfinished Kalta Minor minaret.



ISTANBUL

The legendary city formerly known as Constantinople was probably the most important center for East-West trade for well over 1,000 years. Visit the fabulous Hagia Sophia, a building that has influenced Western architecture since the 6th century. Also see the Blue Mosque, the Roman hippodrome, the opulent Topkapi Palace, and the Grand Bazaar, one of the largest and oldest covered markets in the world.



OUR AIRCRAFT - DE HAVILLAND DASH-8





Our **DHC-8 400** aircraft is the world's most advanced turboprop boasting the lowest fuel consumption and CO2 emissions per passenger compared to similarly-sized aircraft, and when compared to the most efficient narrowbody jets, produces 50% lower emissions, all without compromising speed. Moreover, the DHC-8 400 is the first aircraft to meet the most recent and stringent noise emission standards, an achievement that reflects its low community noise footprint during take-off and landing. Finally, the aircraft's tactically flexible, able to use shorter runways, allows access to destinations not possible with larger aircraft.

The 72 Economy Class seats are configured in 2 by 2 seating with a single aisle. By limiting this expedition to just 32 participants, each traveler will enjoy having a window seat and a free seat next to them, with an armrest that can be raised to provide ample space and comfort.

GENERAL INFORMATION (continued)

WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a moderately strenuous program that is at times busy and physically demanding. Daily programs can involve up to two miles of walking, often on uneven terrain. Stairs may not have handrails. Participants must be physically fit and in active good health. Average high temperatures are likely to be in the low- to mid-70s, occasionally reaching into the 80s. As of publication, SARS-COV-2 (COVID 19) vaccinations are required for all participants as well as tour staff and aircraft crew. Up-to-date COVID-related protocols and procedures will be communicated in pre-trip documents. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by the World Affairs Council or Criterion Travel, our tour operator, local staff, and host country laws

Tour costs are based upon current fuel prices, currency values, taxeffs, and a minimum number of participants. While we will do everything possible to maintain the listed prices, they are subject to change. If there are significant changes, details and costs will be advised prior to departure.

GROUP SIZE

This program is limited to 32 participants, including travelers from the Archaeological Institute of America, the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the Santa Barbara Museum of Art.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Complete Terms and Conditions including Statement of Responsibility will be made available to you at time of registration, or in advance upon request. A signed "Terms & Conditions, Release from Liability, Assumption of Risk and Binding Arbitration Clause" is required from each applicant prior to participation on the tour.

RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS

An initial deposit of \$2,500 per person is required to reserve space on this program. A second deposit of \$5,000 per person is due by March 18, 2023 (six months prior to departure). These deposits are applied to final payment of the tour price. Final payment deadline is May 22, 2023 (120 days prior to departure). CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS

Upon payment of the \$2,500 per-person initial deposit, all reservations are subject to the cancellation provisions set forth below and by which the passenger agrees to be bound. Cancellations shall not be in effect until they are received in writing and confirmed by the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia. Cancellations within 7 days of booking: Full refund of deposit (unless it is after the final payment date of May 22, 2023). Cancellations 7 days or more after booking but before March 18, 2023 (the second deposit due date): Initial deposit is

nonrefundable. Cancellations between March 18, 2023, and May 22, 2023 (final payment date): \$2,500 is refundable. Cancellations between May 22, 2023 and June 20, 2023 (90 days prior to departure), a 50% refund of total tour cost will be issued. After June 20, 2023 there will be no refunds. Cancellation by the World Affairs Council at any time: All payments will be refunded. Trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended. Note: Neither the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia nor Criterion Travel, the tour operator, accepts liability for any airline cancellation penalties incurred with the purchase of nonrefundable tickets.
