
Laura Liswood

Laura Liswood co-founded the Council of Women World Leaders with President Vigdís Finnbogadóttir of Iceland and President Mary Robinson of Ireland, and serves as its Secretary General. The Council is composed of female presidents, prime ministers and heads of government; membership now stands at 90 women, many from the Baltic and Scandinavian regions.

An international, award-winning speaker, she is the only person to have traveled around the world to meet with all the female heads of state and heads of government. Her interviews are chronicled in her book and video documentary, "Women World Leaders: Great Politicians Tell Their Stories." From 2002 to 2015, Liswood held the position of Senior Advisor at Goldman Sachs, where she was previously Managing Director, Global Leadership and Diversity. After the events of September 11, 2001, in the United States, she became a reserve police officer in Washington, D.C. Liswood holds an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School

and B.A. and J.D. degrees. She is admitted to practice law in California and Massachusetts.

An adventurous traveler, Liswood has bicycled across Siberia and the Silk Road. She is the author of four books: "The Elephant and the Mouse: Moving Beyond the Illusion of Inclusion," "The Loudest Duck: Moving Beyond Diversity," "Women World Leaders," and "Serving Them Right."



In his oft-quoted poem, "The Road Not Taken," Robert Frost awakened the idea and determination in many to choose the road less traveled; to overcome fear and avoid regrets. It sparked the quest for adventure in those wishing to experience more from life. Oslo, Norway

Day 2 | July 21

Arrive at Oslo Gardermoen Airport. Transfer to embark the deluxe **World Traveller**. Savor dinner on board. (D)

Gothenburg, Sweden Day 3 | July 22

Take a morning tour of Sweden's gregarious second city. Compact and eminently walkable, the city is known for its Amsterdam-style canals, leafy boulevards and welcoming atmosphere. This afternoon, drive through the scenic Swedish countryside, passing remarkable glacial formations along Lake Lygnern. Continue south to the peninsula, where Tjolöholm Castle sits. Stroll through the castle and gardens. This evening, join your fellow travelers for the Captain's

Welcome Reception and Dinner. (B,L,D,R)

Copenhagen, Denmark Day 4 | July 23

On a tour of the world-class capital of Denmark, drive to the site of the old fish market, Gammel Strand, to embark on a sightseeing cruise through the canals and the port of Copenhagen. Pass major buildings such as Christiansborg Palace, the Naval Church and the Old Stock Exchange before entering the harbor where you will see the ancient Battery Sixtus and the fortress, Three Crowns. Spend time at leisure exploring Copenhagen this afternoon. (B.L.D)

Gdansk, Poland Day 5 | July 24

On a tour of the city, stop at the entrance to the historic Gdansk Shipyard, where the Solidarity Movement — the first independent trade union in the Soviet Bloc — began in 1980. Continue to the Green Gate, where the Old Town tour begins. See Gdansk port, the Motława River, and the iconic Gdansk Crane. Stroll along the Royal Route and the Long Wharf to see the magnificent Neptune's Fountain; the 14th-century Artus Court, inspired by Britain's King Arthur; and St. Mary's Church. (B,L,D)

Klaipėda, Lithuania Day 6 | July 25

Klaipeda is a port city with a strong seafaring identity. The old town features German-style, 18th-century wood-framed buildings, winding cobblestone lanes and red-brick warehouses. Unusual statues are a delight to discover throughout the town. Today, choose your included excursion: visit nearby Palanga with its Amber Museum, or venture to the UNESCO-listed Curonian Spit. (B,L,D)





Riga, Latvia Day 7 | July 26

Begin the day with a tour of the city, including the UNESCO-inscribed Historic Centre of Riga. Then in a Jewish heritage exploration, learn of the moving Jewish history of Riga, long a multicultural melting pot. Visit the former sites of the Great Choral Synagogue and Old Jewish Cemetery; important memorials; and the New Ghetto Museum. (B,L,D)

Day at Sea Day 8 | July 27

Spend the full day at sea taking in the scenery, enjoying onboard lectures and mingling with fellow passengers. Enjoy three delicious meals and the many luxurious amenities on board.(B,L,D)

Helsinki, Finland Day 9 | July 28

Helsinki, the capital of Finland, is also known as "Daughter

of the Baltic Sea." Take a panoramic motorcoach tour including the city's highlights. Pass by the colorful Market Square in the South Harbour and stop to see the modernist Sibelius Monument, an artistic homage to Finland's most famous composer. Visit the subterranean Temppeliaukio Church (if no church services are in progress) called the "Rock Church," as it was impressively hewn into solid natural bedrock. This afternoon, choose your excursion: visit the charming village of Porvoo, or indulge in a quintessential restorative Finnish sauna ritual. (B,L,D)

Tallinn, Estonia Day 10 | July 29

Tallinn's UNESCO World Heritage-designated Historic Centre (Old Town) has remained virtually unchanged for 600 years. Tour around the ancient city walls, then begin a walking tour of Toompea, the hill on which Tallinn is centered. See the landmark 19th-century Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, and Toompea Castle. Continue your walking tour down narrow streets and steep stairs to the Lower Town. Visit the medieval Tallinn Town Hall, the seat of Estonia's Parliament, and the only surviving Gothic hall in Europe. Admire the intricately painted main chamber and the quest book signed by Mikhail Gorbachev and the Dalai Lama. Say farewell at the Captain's Reception and Dinner this evening. (B,L,D,R)

Stockholm, Sweden/ Return to Home City Day 11 | July 30

Following breakfast, disembark and transfer to Stockholm Arlanda Airport for your return flight home. (B)

Norway July 16 to 21, 2025 (Program Begins: July 17)

In historic Bergen, visit the UNESCO World Heritage site of Bryggen, the old wharf; and Troldhaugen, the historic home of composer Edvard Grieg. Then travel through pristine fjordlands on the famed *Flåm Railway*, one of the world's most scenic train rides. Relish a cruise into UNESCO World Heritagedesignated Nærøyfjord, and transfer to Stalheim for one night at the historic *Stalheim Hotel*. In Oslo, enjoy a city tour with visits to Vigeland Sculpture Park and the Opera House. Accommodations are for four nights at ideally located hotels.


Stockholm July 30 to August 1, 2025 (Program Ends: August 1)
