



#### Day 1: Depart U.S. for Cairo, Egypt

**Day 2: Arrive Cairo** We arrive in the Egyptian capital and transfer to our hotel. As guests' arrival times may vary greatly, we have no group activities or meals planned.


**Day 3: Cairo** After a morning briefing, our full-day tour begins at the acclaimed Egyptian Museum, the world's greatest repository of ancient relics. Then we tour the Citadel of Saladin housing the alabaster Mosque of Mohamed Ali. Tonight we enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. *B*,*L*,*D* 

# Day 4: Cairo/Abu Simbel/Embark Lake Nasser

**Cruise** Early this morning we fly to Aswan. Upon arrival we ride across a corner of the Sahara to Abu Simbel. We board our ship for lunch together then visit the site with an inspiring history. After our visit, we have an afternoon at leisure aboard our ship. As the desert sun goes down, we return to Abu Simbel and experience a sound-and-light show amid the massive statuary here. Then, we return to the Omar el Khayam in time for dinner on board. *B*,*L*,*D* 

Day 5: Lake Nasser Cruising – Kasr Ibrim/Amada/ Wadi el-Seboua We sail to the settlement of Kasr Ibrim, the last vestige of Nubian culture still in its original location. After a brief visit during which we learn about this ancient settlement from aboard the ship (it's prohibited to go ashore here), we continue on to Amada, where we tour the 18th-dynasty Temple of Amada, built during the reign of Tutmosis III and the oldest surviving Lake Nasser temple. Then we sail on to Wadi el-Seboua, where we dock for the night. *B,L,D* 

Day 6: Lake Nasser Cruising – Wadi el-Seboua/ Valley of the Lions/Aswan We spend this morning in Wadi el-Seboua touring the Valley of the Lions with its striking avenue of sphinxes. This afternoon, we cruise to Aswan, the city where Agatha Christie wrote the famous *Death on the Nile*. We enjoy lunch and dinner together on board. Late this evening, we arrive in Aswan and spend the evening on board. *B*,*L*,*D*

### Day 7: Disembark/Aswan/Embark Nile Cruise

**Ship** We disembark our ship early this morning in the desert lands of Aswan and set out to visit New Kalabsha, site of Kalabsha Temple, the largest freestanding Nubian temple of them all. After exploring the site, we return to our ship for breakfast then bid farewell to the crew as we embark on a tour of the Aswan High Dam. Next, we visit the Temples of Philae on the island of Agilkia. Our temple touring in Aswan complete, we board the second ship of the tour, our floating hotel for our three-night stay on the Nile. After lunch on board, we embark small *feluccas*, replicas of ancient Nile sailboats, for a relaxing afternoon sail. *B,L,D* 

# Day 8: Nile Cruising – Kom Ombo/Edfu/Luxor

This morning, we sail to the ancient trading town of Kom Ombo, which sat on the great caravan route from Nubia. After returning to our ship, we sail on to Edfu where we explore the Temple of Horus, considered Egypt's best-preserved ancient temple. Tonight, we attend the Captain's welcome cocktail party wearing traditional Egyptian *galabeya*. Late this evening, we arrive at Luxor where we dock. *B,L,D* 

Day 9: Nile Cruising – Luxor/West Bank This morning we embark on an exploration of the Luxor West Bank. We begin at the haunting Valley of the Kings and Valley of the Queens, an isolated valley holding the tombs of more than 50 New Kingdom monarchs and nobles. To visit all the tombs would be impossible; our tour director will select some of the most interesting for us to see. *B,L,D* 

Day 10: Disembark/Luxor/East Bank Today we disembark our ship and explore the East Bank, beginning at Karnak. Then we cruise to Luxor, the world's "greatest open-air museum," whose vast temple complexes, tombs,

and statues dating from 2755 BGE represent the pinnacle of Egyptian architecture. Today we explore the East Bank, home of Karnak, the greatest temple complex of them all, whose ruins stretch for more than a mile. We also visit Luxor Temple, whose builders included both Tutankhamun and Alexander the Great. We then check in at our hotel, where we dine together tonight. *B,L,D* 

**Day 11:** Luxor We have the choice to rise very early to see the West Bank from above on an optional hot

**Day 12:** Luxor/Cairo Early this morning we fly to Cairo today, where this afternoon we visit the Khan el-Khalili bazaar. *B* 

**Day 13: Cairo** This morning we encounter the astounding Pyramids of Giza, the wonders of antiquity that have drawn visitors for millennia. Here, too, we see the enigmatic Sphinx, whose leonine body and human face were carved from a single piece of limestone, then buried by desert sands for centuries. After lunch, we explore Old Cairo, where early capital cities once stood. We visit  $5^{\rm th}$  century St. Sergius Church, the Coptic church of el-Muallaqa, and the active  $10^{\rm th}$ -century St. George's church.  $B_{\rm s}L$

The following is intended to provide you with a description of what to expect when you reserve this tour. Upon booking, you will be asked to acknowledge your acceptance of the full Terms and Conditions on the secure on-line portal, My Odyssev.

Not Included in Tour Price: Airfare when purchasing a Land Only package; costs of passports and visas, if required; immunizations and inoculations; personal expenses such as beverages, laundry, room service, and meals not specified; airport transfers when purchasing a Land Only package; communication charges; optional sightseeing or shore excursions; gratuities to your Odysseys Unlimited Tour Director and shipboard personnel, which are at your discretion (suggested gratuities: \$10.\$15 per traveler, per day); and travel protection insurance.
