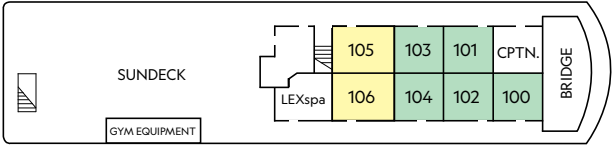

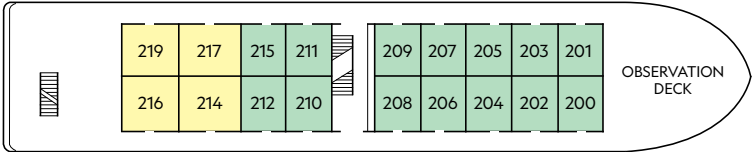

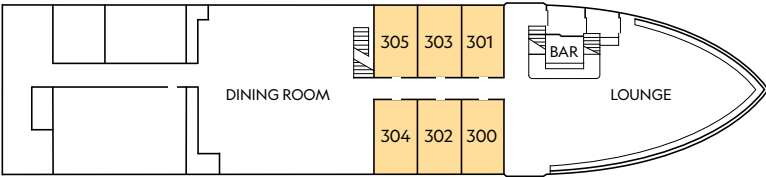
### SHIP DECK PLAN & PRICING
