

Gerald J. Prokopowicz, a professor at East Carolina University, specializes in Public History and the Civil War era. He hosts Civil War Talk Radio and has authored Did Lincoln Own Slaves? and All for the Regiment. Formerly the resident Lincoln Scholar at the Lincoln Museum, he helped create the awardwinning exhibit Abraham Lincoln and the American Experiment and edited Lincoln Lore.

He serves on advisory boards for the Lincoln Studies Center and the Lincoln Forum and holds degrees from the University of Michigan and a Ph.D. from Harvard.

• Day 1 [Nov 16th] - Charleston, SC

• Begin in historic Charleston, the birthplace of the Civil War. Visit **Fort Sumter**, where the first shots were fired in April 1861, setting the war in motion. That evening, gather for a Welcome Reception with your historian to preview the journey ahead.

Day 2 [Nov 17th]- Charleston, SC


 Tour the CSS Hunley Museum, home to the first successful combat submarine, and uncover the mystery of its final mission. Then, transfer to your cruise ship and settle in as your historian delivers a lecture on the Civil War's coastal campaigns.

Day 3 [Nov 18th]- Beaufort, SC

 Dock in Beaufort, SC, a key Union stronghold and site of the Port Royal Experiment. Visit the Parris Island Museum, then explore historic Beaufort on a ranger-led tour of its role in wartime emancipation.

Day 4 [Nov 19th] - Hilton Head, SC

 Enjoy a day at sea with expert-led lectures covering military strategy, naval innovation, and the war's impact on civilians, alongside the ship's amenities.



• Day 5 [Nov 20th] - Savannah, GA

 Begin at Fort Pulaski, a Union stronghold that fell in 1862. Then, explore Savannah's historic district, with stops at the Owens-Thomas House, the Green-Meldrim House (Sherman's headquarters), and the Webb Military Museum.

• Day 6 [Nov 21st] - On the Water

• Cruise while enjoying the ship's amenities and historian-led lectures on the Union's "Anaconda Plan" and the war's broader impact.

• Day 7 [Nov 22nd]- Brunswick, GA


 Travel to Fort McAllister, a remarkably preserved Confederate earthwork fort that withstood multiple Union attacks before falling in 1864. Return to Brunswick for a stroll through its charming historic district.

• Day 8 [Nov 23rd]- Amelia Island, FL

 Visit Fort Clinch, a key coastal defense held by Union troops and home to the first African American regiment in the Union Army.
Then, tour Olustee Battlefield, Florida's largest Civil War battle site, following a scenic walking trail with interpretive stops.

• Day 9 [Nov 24th] - Home from Jacksonville, FL

 After breakfast aboard the ship, transfer to Jacksonville International Airport (JAX), concluding your Civil War journey with a deeper understanding of the war's coastal campaigns.
